# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 30 June 2019

The Society's objective is to encourage the study and discussion of clinical and scientific medical work and to promote research for the ultimate benefit of the public.

#### **ACTIVITIES AND PERFORMANCE**

## **Fundraising activities**

The Society raises its funds through membership subscription and conference sponsorship. The Society also receives additional income from its investment holdings and savings interest.

#### Activities and achievements in year

The Society held a successful and well attended scientific meeting in Edinburgh. The meeting provides important networking opportunities and included numerous talks from top invited speakers covering a range of topical subjects in the field of medicine. It also included presentation of the latest research and the Society awarded prizes for the best poster and platform presentations. The Fitzgerald Peel lecture was delivered by Prof Marianne Nicolson from the University of Aberdeen. The trainees session was very well attended. The Society awarded prizes for the best trainee presentations at the meeting. A research grant was awarded to Dr Adrian Stanley for £5,000 for investigation of gastrointestinal bleeding. A second research grant was awarded to Dr McNeill for £1,000.

#### **Financial review**

During the year to 30 June 2019, there was income of £12,716 (2018: £13,122). Total expenditure was £13,694 (2018: £6,885) resulting in a deficit of £977 (2018: £6,236 surplus).

Meeting sponsorship was £6,020 (2018: £6,000) and total income for the scientific meeting was £10,585 (2018: £11,090).

The Society has no formal policy on investments but has a portfolio of investments that consists of a stocks and shares ISA account and a National Savings and Investments Account.

The Trustees did not receive any remuneration during the year.

During the year the trustees claimed no reimbursement of expenses (2018: £130).

The Society held distributable funds of £41,164 (2018: £42,140). The market value of the investments as at 30 June 2019 was £41,517 (2018: £42,495).

## STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILTIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in Scotland, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the provisions of the charity's constitution requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the provisions of the charity's constitution. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
