STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Society is controlled by its governing document, the Scottish Society of Physicians constitution and rules. The constitution was amended at the Annual General Meeting held on 30 October 2015. The Society constitutes an unincorporated association.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting or by written election in the interim via a poll amongst the members. Nomination for office bearers are invited from the membership.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Charitable purpose

The Society's objective is to encourage the study and discussion of clinical and scientific medical work and to promote research for the ultimate benefit of the public.

ACTIVITIES AND PERFORMANCE

Fundraising activities

The Society raises its funds through membership subscription and conference sponsorship. The Society also receives additional income from its investment holdings and savings interest.

Activities and achievements in year

The Society held a successful and well attended scientific meeting in Dunblane. The meeting provides important networking opportunities and included numerous talks from top invited speakers covering a range of topical subjects in the field of medicine. It also included presentation of the latest research and the Society awarded prizes for the best poster and platform presentations. The Fitzgerald Peel lecture was delivered by Prof John McMurray. A research grant of £4,462 was awarded to Dr Neeraj Dhaun in Edinburgh, funding a project entitled 'Assessment of retina and choroid using optical coherence tomography in health, hypertension & chronic kidney disease'.

Financial review

During the year there was a further decrease in the receipts to £1,000 (2015: £1,659) relating to the conference and a decrease in payments to £500 (2015: £2,360) relating to the holding of the conference. Together with lecture and prizes costs of £550 (2015: £800) the conference operated at a small loss. The main purpose of the conference is to provide education. The loss from this year's conference has been due to problems of procuring sufficient industry sponsorship which remains a challenge.

The Society has no formal policy on investments but has a portfolio of investments that consists of a stocks and shares ISA account and a National Savings and Investments Account.

The Trustees did not receive any remuneration during the year.

During the year the trustees did not receive any reimbursement of expenses incurred in their duties as trustees (2015: £62).

Due to a reduction in the level of costs but a slight fall in receipts, the Society has a surplus in the year of £555 compared to a deficit of £3,350 in the previous financial year.

As a result of the surplus, the Society held distributable funds of £40,218 (2015: £39,663). The market value of the investments as at 30 June 2016 was £37,001 (2015: £38,451).

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILTIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 30 June 2016

The law applicable to charities in Scotland, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the provisions of the charity's constitution requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the provisions of the charity's constitution. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
