STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Society is controlled by its governing document, the Scottish Society of Physicians constitution and rules. The constitution was amended at the Annual General Meeting held on 30 October 2015. The Society constitutes an unincorporated association.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting or by written election in the interim via a poll amongst the members. Nomination for office bearers are invited from the membership.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Charitable purpose

The Society's objective is to encourage the study and discussion of clinical and scientific medical work and to promote research for the ultimate benefit of the public.

ACTIVITIES AND PERFORMANCE

Fundraising activities

The Society raises its funds through membership subscription and conference sponsorship. The Society also receives additional income from its investment holdings and savings interest.

Activities and achievements in year

The Society held a successful and well attended scientific meeting in Glasgow. The meeting provides important networking opportunities and included numerous talks from top invited speakers covering a range of topical subjects in the field of medicine. It also included presentation of the latest research and the Society awarded prizes for the best poster and platform presentations. The Fitzgerald Peel lecture was delivered by Prof John McConnell. The Society awarded prizes for the best trainee presentations at the meeting. Dr Stephen-Makin-was-awarded a Research-Project-Grant-of £3,565 for a study entitled 'Dietary salt and background small vessel disease'. A research grant of £1,500 was awarded to Dr Alisdair McNeill for his application entitled 'A study of Parkinson's disease risk in adults with 22q11 deletion syndrome'. The Society also awarded a travel grant of £200 to Mr U Bhalraam, a medical student in Dundee to present his work at the American College of Cardiology Conference.

Financial review

During the year to 30 June 2017, there was an increase in receipts from the scientific meeting in Glasgow of £3,937 (2016: £1,000). However, there has been a gradual decrease in subscription receipts and increased expenditure relating to the 2015 and 2016 meetings £6,205 (2016: £500) which have contributed to a deficit between income and expenditure of the year of £4,312 (2016: £555 - surplus). The loss reflects continuing challenges with procuring sufficient industry sponsorship for the scientific meeting and ensuring recruitment of new members outstrips retrials and departures.

The Society has no formal policy on investments but has a portfolio of investments that consists of a stocks and shares ISA account and a National Savings and Investments Account.

The Trustees did not receive any remuneration during the year.

During the year the trustees claimed reimbursement of expenses amounting to £203 which were incurred in their duties as trustees (2016: £Nil).

The Society held distributable funds of £35,904 (2016: £40,218). The market value of the investments as at 30 June 2017 was £41,829 (2016: £37,001).

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILTIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in Scotland, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the provisions of the charity's constitution requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the provisions of the charity's constitution. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
