

HIAP-Scotland Portal

The Health Innovation Assessment Portal (HIAP-Scotland) is an online platform which has been designed as a single-point resource to develop stronger partnerships between NHSScotland and industry.

The Portal provides potential suppliers with information, guidance and support on how to develop ideas and innovations into products and technologies which may be of use to NHSS, or to further develop established innovative products.

This initiative forms part of the response to Scottish Government's 'Statement of Intent for Health and Wealth'

How it works

The Innovation Portal allows innovators to liaise with NHSScotland at an early opportunity while crucial decisions can still be influenced.

Innovators submit a solution which must be linked to at least one of 32 areas of improvement which have been identified by NHSS on to the portal providing information in six sections:

- General Information
- Strategic Fit
- Benefits
- Evidence and Readiness
- Commercials
- Other Information

The solutions are assessed and NHS provides feedback on these in a transparent and consistent way.

Assessors

The role of an assessor is to use professional expertise to evaluate submitted information and evidence by providing constructive criticism on innovators' solutions. By doing so, you can contribute to the future of Scottish healthcare by helping to identify innovative technologies which have the potential to become incorporated into NHSS service

Assessors follow a simple scoring methodology by grading each response using the following key and adding any additional comments.

Red – Not of interest (or insufficient evidence or information)

Amber – Has potential

Green - Worthwhile

Black - Not applicable
